Service Aims and Objectives

Tennyson House is a specialist rehabilitation unit utilising the recovery model, located within the grounds of The North London Clinic.

This unit provides supervised and supported recovery services in residential style accommodation, comprising four flats with four beds and one three-bedded flat. Tennyson House promotes progressive independence by building the residents living skills, their insight, education and confidence needed to return safely to the community.

Tennyson House benefits from 24-hour nursing care and 24-hour medical cover, with input from a full forensic multidisciplinary team.

Treatment Programmes

Treatment programmes at Tennyson House are aimed at helping individuals to reach their optimum level of functioning by enhancing their functional or social skills, promoting healthy lifestyles and maintaining and developing self care skills.

Programmes of recovery are individually designed for each person's specific needs.



Multidisciplinary Team

Care is provided by a range of experienced healthcare professionals and includes input from: consultant forensic psychiatrists, nurses, psychologists, social workers, occupational therapists and support workers.

All individuals in Tennyson House are subject to the provisions of the Care Programme Approach.

Facilities

Individuals in Tennyson House have full use of a range of on-site facilities at The North London Clinic, including a fully equipped gymnasium, art and computer rooms, rehabilitation kitchens and a library, as well as seeking to utilise appropriate facilities in the local community.

Admission Criteria:

- Men over the age of 18 years
- Detained and informal men with or without offending histories who benefit from recovery based programmes
- Admissions can be accepted from a range of settings including secure hospitals, psychiatric intensive care units and the community

- Individuals with a degree of dependency relating to mental health, physical health and mobility needs, for whom quality of life is a primary feature of care needs

- Individuals in the community, whose community placement has broken down due to deterioration in mental health, behavioural problems, or crises in personal, domestic and family circumstances. Certain individuals with mental health needs may have just been released from prison or are deemed to be inappropriately placed in a probation/ re-settlement hostel.
