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Brain Injury Services

Grafton Manor provides specialist rehabilitation for adults with Acquired Brain Injury and other, compatible neurological disorders. The Manor comprises 13 en-suite rooms, a bed-sit, a flat and a two bedroomed cottage, with The Chantry, a long term home within the grounds of Grafton Manor for those who continue to require a high level of care.

Grafton is set within 5 acres of beautiful grounds in a Northamptonshire hamlet, with good access to local towns and their amenities.

Service Aims and Objectives

We offer rehabilitation for individuals to address the complex difficulties often evident after a brain injury; whether cognitive, physical or behavioural to maximise independence and encourage transference of learned skills into everyday life.

Treatment Programmes

Each person has a programme compiled to meet their unique needs, combining the specialist input of the therapists, nurses and clinicians, and carried out by the individual with support from the rehabilitation team.



There is a commitment to identifying goals and working with the individual to achieve them, to promote involvement and mutual development of the care pathway.

Facilities

All residents are able to make use of the Development Centre, which includes:

- A gymnasium
- A spacious area for arts, crafts, activities etc
- Kitchen facilities.

We provide a practice kitchen where people can learn domestic skills, two lounges in which to relax and also a quiet room in which to receive visitors.

Conveniently situated, we are able to access appropriate vocational workshops and colleges, as well as theatres, cinemas, shops and pubs.

Within Northampton we have two, three bedded houses (Grafton House) which provide long term care in a warm and welcoming community environment.

Admission Criteria:

Grafton Manor /The Chantry

- Adults over 18 years old
- Informal, voluntary admission
- Admission from a range of settings, e.g. hospital, alternative care homes and the community.

Grafton House

- Adults over the age of 30
- Able to climb stairs – as bedrooms are on 1st floor
- Often admission from a more supportive environment in which the level of supervision is no longer needed or from home where a person is finding it difficult to manage.

Further information and referrals

All referrals are reviewed daily and we will strive to carry out a day visit assessment, including risk assessment within 48 hours.
