Comfortable and homely

We believe a comfortable environment enhances our patient’s recovery. Oakwood provides comfortable and homely accommodation with a large sitting room, dining room, conservatory, activity rooms, two kitchens, and a self contained garden area. The bedrooms are located upstairs and are equipped with an en-suite toilet and sink.

Practicing skills in a real life environment

Oakwood caters for patients with varying needs, including those with complex mental health issues and those at risk of demonstrating sexually problematic behaviours or the use of aggression. It is suitable for individuals progressing through one of two care pathways.

The first pathway is intended for those individuals who have progressed through their treatment and now need to practice the skills they have developed, in a real life environment. The second pathway is aimed at those individuals for whom previous treatment has not reduced their risk or enhanced their

skills enough to enable them to live successfully in community settings. However they have progressed sufficiently to enable the level of physical security to be reduced.

Pathway to recovery

Treatment pathways are facilitated by a highly skilled and experienced multidisciplinary team. Treatment involves graded access to the community and focuses on empowering patients to take responsibility for their recovery within a framework of managed risk. For patients progressing through the first pathway, this will involve intense rehabilitation to practice the skills that they have developed through treatment, in a real life environment. For patients progressing through the second pathway, rehabilitation will focus on the prevention of deterioration and the management of the risk they pose to themselves and others.

We welcome referrals for Oakwood for patients who would benefit from either of these two care pathways.
