He is Editor of the Journal of Forensic Psychiatry and Psychology and has recently chaired a NICE Guideline Committee on the treatment of Antisocial Personality Disorder.

## Professor Paul Rogers, RMN, PhD, MSc (Econ), MRCPsych (Hon), PG Cert ENB 650, PG Dip Behavioural Psychotherapy, BABCP Accredited CBT therapist

Paul has worked within the NHS and private sector since 1986 as a Cognitive Behaviour Therapist, seconded to the Maudsley Hospital / Institute of Psychiatry. He has published widely on Cognitive Behaviour Therapy and since 1994, has seen in excess of 1000 patients for Cognitive Behaviour assessment and/or therapy. Much of this work has been under Medico-Legal direction and Paul regularly writes treatment reports for Solicitors and the Courts.

In 2009 he was awarded a Joint MRC/Welsh Assembly Clinical Research Training Fellowship and is investigating the relationship between alcohol and violence in young people.

**Pamela J Taylor** is Professor of Forensic Psychiatry, School of Medicine, Cardiff University, honorary consultant forensic psychiatrist ABMU and Cardiff & Vale Health Boards and advisor on forensic psychiatry to the Chief Medical Officer for Wales. She runs the Offender Health Research Network-Cymru (OHRN-C). She is co-editor, with John Gunn, of the imminent second edition of the textbook *Forensic Psychiatry, Clinical Legal and Ethical Issues*, lead editor of the journal *Criminal Behaviour and Mental Health* and international editor of *Behavioral Sciences and the Law*.

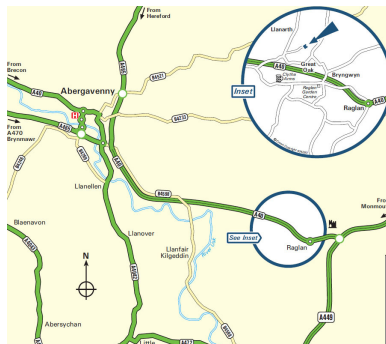
