Recovery

Our commitment to the recovery model ensures that the needs of the patient are always our paramount consideration. The Recovery Star provides valuable, tangible evidence for the patient of progress along their treatment pathway. Patients are supported to chair their CPA meetings, giving them an equal voice in the planning of their treatment. An active independent advocacy service provides support and empowerment to all our patients.

Patients actively engage

Patients at Oaktree Manor are fully involved in the shaping of service delivery at the hospital, via the Patient Forum. Examples of active engagement include advising on changes to the physical environment, designing and creating a sensory garden, menu planning, patient led audits, attendance at clinical governance meetings and delivering key elements of staff training programmes, such as advocacy and Recovery Star. Wherever possible patients are key partners in the recruitment of staff.

Education and recreation

The Oaktree Centre is the educational and recreational hub of the hospital. The centre is an accredited Award Scheme Development and Accreditation Network (ASDAN) college, providing a structured format that delivers learning at the patient's pace through meaningful activities. ASDAN courses provide the patient with certificates of achievement and recognised qualifications.

The Oaktree Centre team actively promote the development of work skills and community engagement through the opportunity for voluntary work placements in the local community.

The teaching of life long skills to enable a patient to be moved through their care pathway at a pace that suits the individual, ensuring a safe and effective discharge that fully recognises these skills, is the key goal of treatment.
